January Facts

The name for January comes from the Roman God Janus, who is always depicted with two heads. He uses one head to look back on the year before and the other head to look forward to the New Year!

Originally, the Roman calendar had only 10 months, and it excluded January and February. King Numa Pompilius, the second king of Rome, is responsible for adding both January and February to the Roman calendar. Even so, it only had 30 days. Finally, Julius Caesar added the 31st day to the month and completed it to the full month of January that we practice now!

Generally, January is the coldest month of the year in the Northern Hemisphere. The equivalent month of January in terms of temperature in the Southern Hemisphere is July!

January has two zodiac signs – Capricorn, which is until January 19, and Aquarius, which is for the rest of the month.

The *Dianthus caryophullus* is the primary birth flower of January – more commonly known as the carnation! January's other birth flower is the humble snowdrop.
